HOW IT BEGAN

It all began in middle of 2013, when I was sitting down watching *Miss Potter*, starting in 2006 with Renée Zellweger.

Miss Potter is a movie about Beatrix Potter (1866-1943), a renowned English children's author and illustrator. In many ways, I feel myself reflected in this movie. In that era, opportunities for women were limited, but Beatrix Potter found her own path through art, writing children's books.

This movie deeply influenced the beginning of my journey as a authoress and, later, as an illustrator.

I must admit that my first steps were not particularly original. I began by adapting and reimagining traditional tales, trying to give them a fresh perspective. I attempted to publish them, but without success.

Even so, I refused to give up, and my first story *Kitty* was born, inspired by my dog Rex, who was lost in forest near our home. I completed the illustrations in a week and wrote text in just two or three days. Excited about the project, I submitted my first book named *Kitty* for publication on Amazon, but the book simply remained as a draft.



Despite my disappointment, I continued to believe in my book. I genuinely loved it and felt a strong attachment to personage. I decided to redraw the illustrations and change the title to *Boneca*, because another book titled *Kitty*, a story about a kitten, had already been published through CreateSpace, Amazon's print publishing service at the time.

I submitted the book *Boneca* once again and it was accepted for publication through CreateSpace in hard cover and added to Amazon's catalogue as e-book.

But, later Amazon limited my access to the platform, and I could not manage my published work.

I can say honestly, when I saw my first little book *Boneca* was completed, with just 18 pages and 9 illustrations, I felt an immense sense of pride, and an enormous love for this little puppy.

Laura Somerset is a pen name choose as a tribute to the woman who inspired the beginning of my career: **Beatrix Potter**.

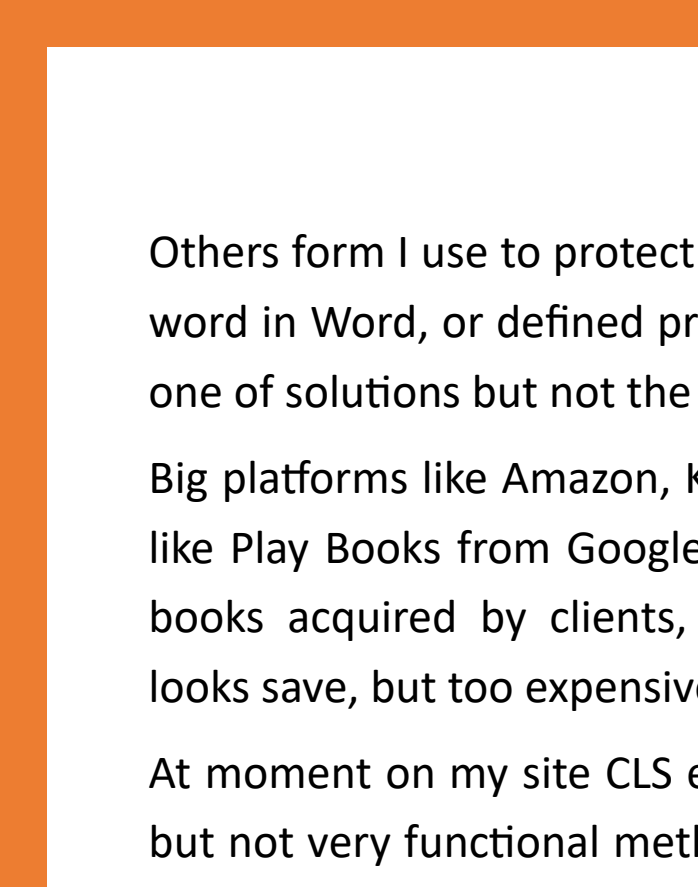


MY FIRST PUBLICATION

After, my first book published *Boneca* at Create Space and Amazon in 2016, I had some problems with Copyright. I read everything about the subject, I made a phone call to IGAC-Portuguese Copyright, and a lady had explained me: *“Oh! You are publish books online, on that place, register or not your book, IGAC had no authority to control property online, that exceeds ours competences, and Portuguese Copyright of a book just worked in paper books and published in Portugal, I do not know anything to protected your book online, but you can read Bern Convention (an International Intellectual Property agreement with several countries in the world)”*. That means, my books published online will not be protected even with registration, especially on foreign platforms like Amazon.

Later, I knew another's forms to protect my Author's Rights online, such Creative Commons, but it did not convince me, I forgave them.

In my opinion what will be correct and more professional, an invisible certificate (except to the owner) made automatically by our computer, made our work belong to a unique computer and user.



Others form I use to protect my work, block with a password in Word, or defined properties of books, it may be one of solutions but not the best.

Big platforms like Amazon, Kobo and Google, have apps like Play Books from Google, an application with the e-books acquired by clients, which just work online, it looks save, but too expensive to editor as CLS e-books.

At moment on my site CLS e-books I chose a new form, but not very functional method, the client purchases an e-book and must accept the Portuguese Agreement about Author's Rights, a legal form to sell e-books and defend my Copyright.

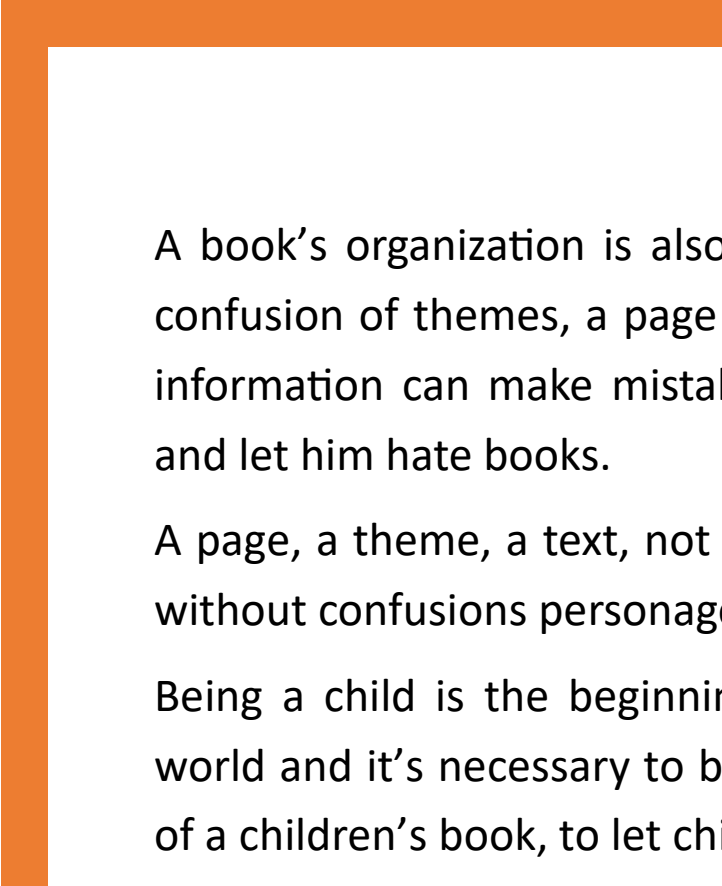
PERSONAGES, ILLUSTRATIONS AND OTHER ELEMENTS

Illustrations on children's book (depending on the book) is the most fascinating to a child, especially with illustrations elements well organized (without miscellany) with objectivity and clarity, a child loves observe illustrations content (get lost in illustrations) like he wants to memorize all the elements on it, or imagine himself inside the story, and try to discover more about story by illustrations.

But, when illustrations elements are too much, or disperses, partly cover, with less defined colors, child loses interest.

Children's books, should have the illustrations and elements quite well defined, organized and at sight, to let the child overview all the element (book size, on this case is also very important) to discover what is each one of them, without boring himself with so many confusion of elements and colors (child can lost interest and be even frustrating with a miscellany book).

Colors are so important, transmit emotions and feelings, if each element is well defined.



A book's organization is also very important, without confusion of themes, a page of a book with too much information can make mistakes and confound a child and let him hate books.

A page, a theme, a text, not very long, not very short, without confusions personages or elements.

Being a child is the beginning of discovery of a new world and it's necessary to be objective in elaboration of a children's book, to let children understand and like the book's content.

Why are children's books so important?

CHILDREN'S BOOKS VS. ADULT'S BOOKS

What is the most difficult creation?

Both are difficult, one in words (more than 250 pages), another in time, making illustrations (10 illustrations).

Each illustration demands time, planning, composition, colored and attention to details.

In many cases, the production of illustrations can consume more time than the words of text.

I know by my own experience, a book with 250 pages can be concluded easier than a children's book (mistakes, make a new illustration again and so on) except digital illustrations, easier to make and rapid conclusion in all points.



Why are children's books more expensive than adult books?

Answer obvious – Illustrations, usually adult books have no illustrations except the cover (comparing with a children's books with more than 10 illustrations).

Illustrations of children's books take more time than writing a text of a book, or a teens book without illustrations, it is a fact.

You should not forget, behind a simple children's book there's an enormous creative work.

- But it is precisely that combination with illustrations and words which made the children's literature so special to children.

- Observing an illustration together;

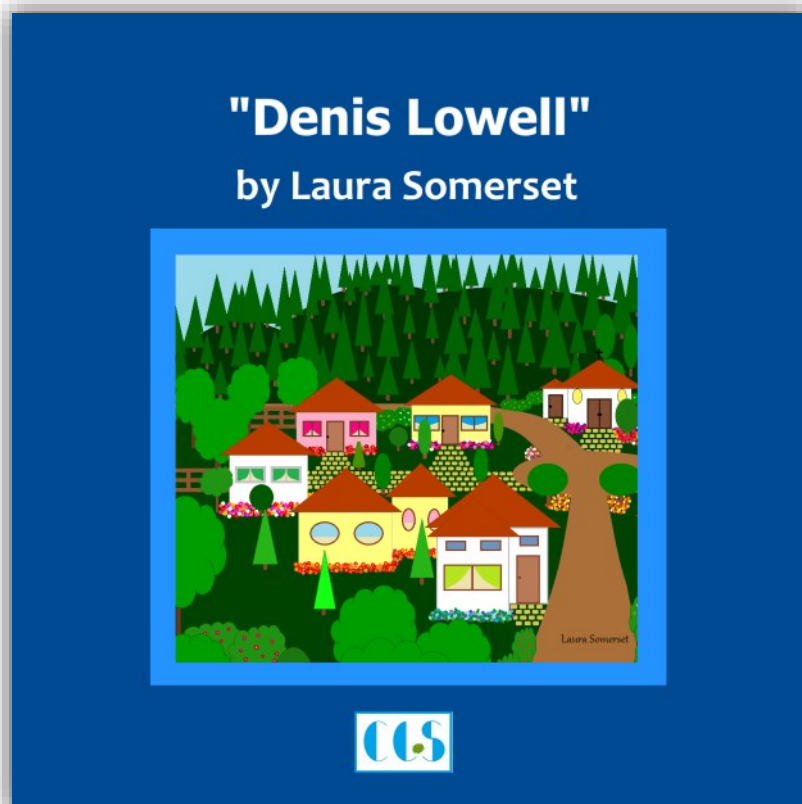

- Reveal emotions the words can describe;

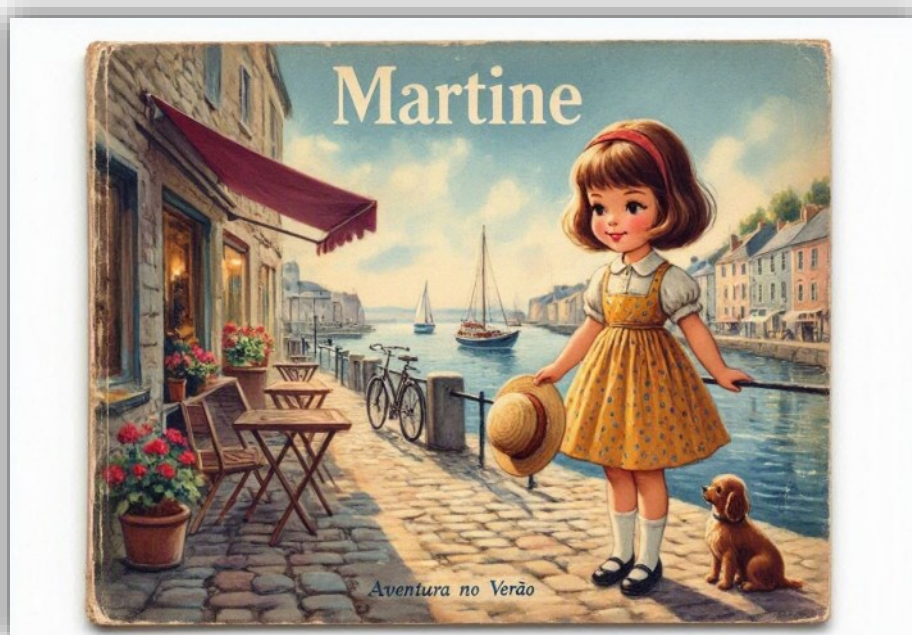
- Connect emotional links between personages

THE EVOLUTION OF LEARN

The Five Verbs That Accompany Us from Childhood to Adulthood Through Youth

- **To See** – The first stage of a child's development and connection with books begins with *seeing*. "*Through the eyes of a child*," as someone said. Just as adults enjoy painting, sculpture, and other forms of visual art without words, children also enjoy looking at picture books, drawings, and illustrations. This is, in reality, a different way of learning and understanding a new and unknown world.

- **To Listen** – The second stage is "*listening a story read by someone*", such as a mother, father, or grandparents. Another form of learning is through listening and, consequently, take on in dialogue by asking questions such as: "*What is...?*" or "*How did it happen...?*", "*Why?*" Questions that require answers and stimulate curiosity, something so important in our life's and without which we would all remain ignorant.

- **To Read** – The third and more advanced stage is *reading*, when a child is already attending school and has learned to read. All children read, he learns how a word is written, how it is spoken, and how it should be used in conversation. Everything continues around the act of learning.

. **To Learn** – The fourth stage, which some persons consider a more advanced phase of school education. In reality, however, all the previous stages were also forms of learning, simply expressed in different ways. Throughout every stage, the person is always learning.

To Know – The fifth stage, which never truly ends. As saying goes, "*Knowledge takes no space,*" and *we are always gaining knowledge*. Those who stop learning become stuck in time, as their lives stop progressing, and it is what we do not want to stop evolution of human beings.

These are verbs that many parents may observe, they are fundamental in their children's lives, from early childhood through adulthood.

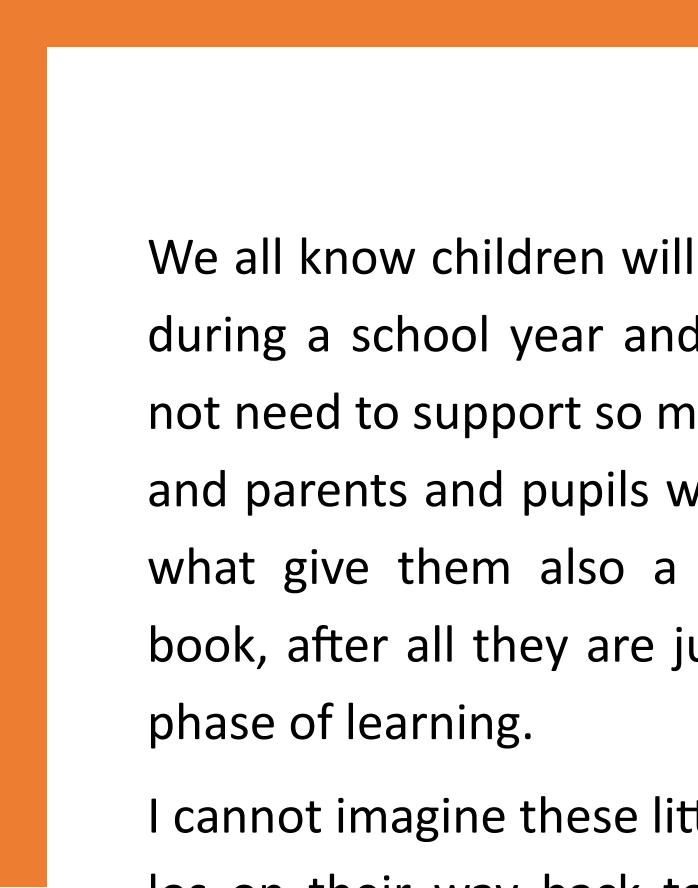

BOOKS SIZE

When, I begin publish my first book online in format Print on Demand, I came across with so many size of books, one book in specially took my attention a A4 to children with 4-6 years old, I thought at time: *“this book looks so big as a child, I hope that will be not a favorite, or child will be clutching to book every day and that means confusion for me”*.

At the time on publishing, my books were always too small to the publishers used, I thought: *“I do want to publish a book with the right size to children 18x18 cm or 19x19 cm the best size to a child with 4-6 years old”*, but there is no one publisher accepting this size.

This, was my second problem with publishers online, but it is not just with publishers online, we just need take a look to schoolbooks in Portugal and size to basic education 1-4 degree, size almost as a A4 to big to children, it should be a little less, sometimes I ask to myself if publishers in Portugal never saw a child, and cannot imagine a better size to books, as 19x21 cm or something like that, in preference with less pages.



We all know children will does not learn all the book during a school year and consequently children will not need to support so many weight on his backpack, and parents and pupils will be very graceful for that, what give them also a reduction of price on the book, after all they are just in first years of school a phase of learning.



I cannot imagine these little children with so many kilos on their way back to school, and they will just learn half or less, but it is ridiculous when all of us should be thinking about reducing consumption by the environment.



As schoolbooks, children's literature is so important in their lives and should obey a standard size in all the world, after all, children grown up at the same rhythm, and the books should be proportional to his height.

The famous A4 should be just to the secondary school or university not to first year of school. I remember in my secondary school my books are littler than the used today for children in their first years of school.



Today, thanks to CLS e-books, my site where I publish my e-books, I choose the size to my books as my wish, always depending on the children age, also the number of pages, everything adapted to age of readers:

18x18 cm x 19x19 cm to children's stories of 4-6 years old;

20x20 cm to children of 6-8 years old;

A5 to teens of 10-12 years old.

Number of pages:

20 pages to children 4-6 years old;

30-40 pages for children 6-8 years old;

40-100 pages for teens of ages 10-12 years old:

With more than 100 pages to teens with more than 15 years old or adults.

When some big publishers in the world are selling books with 90 or more pages and just some illustrations (good ones) I think the children will just understand books when they will have 15 years old.

BOOKS CONTENT

Children's or teen's books content is a preoccupation for me.

About children's books, as I said in my biography, I will work always with themes I consider adequate to young child's, take in consideration that a child have a right to dream, have a fun, play even if parents want transform a child in little adult, that make me feel sad, and I think: *"a child does not must be responsible, just adults, children must be loved, cherished, guided and of course be obedient, but responsibility is a competence from parents"*. Sometimes, that revolt me, when I ear some parents: *"Read the schoolbooks, that are interesting, the others do not mean anything"* an opinion and attitude totally wrong.

In my opinion, I like the idea: *"be a child means exactly be a child"* and not the contrary.

During the last few years I dedicated myself to children's books and I verify, people in the world in general form, specially "media" they sometimes have no sense about what they say or let pass in some TV channels, a wrong idea about children's books and with its opinions influence parents to buy books with wrong themes as: witches, witchcraft, monsters, wars, fights between children and so one, when I think: *"journalists on TV channels should be honest and realistic and assume in public that books are totally inadequate to children, even they are already in school"*.

A children's book should be chosen by its content not because the author is the author of the moment or its top sales.

They just need to look at book size (100 and 500 pages) is not a children's book; I do not know even if it is a teens book, but a children's book definitely not. And it is not because a book talks about a child or a young boy/girl it means it is a children/teens book.

All these opinions and without offense to the authors, which ones have all the right to choose the subject for their books they want, but they need to define target audience very well and inform TV channels about it.

The future of the children on the world, reading this kind of books that upset me, without love, friendship, good feeling, joy, color; books with such an imaginary world so negative, with rage, hate by your opposites, that is maybe the origin of bullying, and what else more in future, the consequences of this kind of books can bring to the future of a child.

I ask adults to let children dream and just show them the better way to guide them and let *children live in own world with their status and the right to be a child.*

When I was young, children's stories were told at fire hold and most of them were examples of behavior as greed in stories "*Fox and Crow*", and so many others, maybe to adults, but at this time, it was like that.

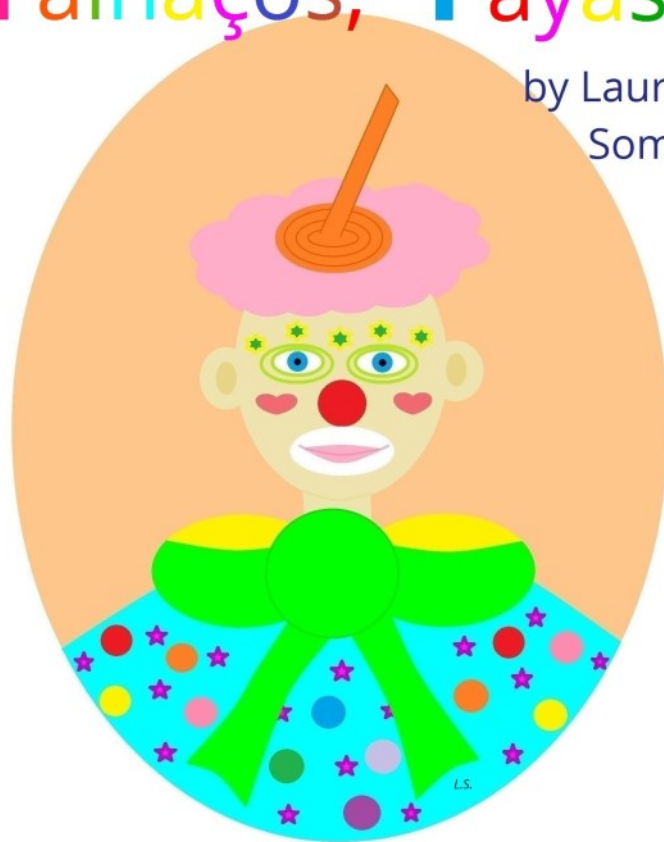
I demand parents let their children choose is own books, and maybe they will be more sensate and intelligent about choosing what they want to read or watch.

COLOR

“Silence language of colors “

Neutral colors make visual balance and let other elements focus on illustrations. White color, peace color, liberty, faith, purity, cleanness and so one, a color which does not transmit great feeling, just release who use it, that is why it is named neutral color, does not give us anything special, but does not take anything, just release, but quite positive to children.

Brilliant colors or appeal colors depending on the way or form they are used, appeal a regard, show vanity, are usually used in galas or commemorations, as new year, birthday...do not have great feelings, just appeal the attention to everyone, means nothing to children's.

In an illustration well created, each color has a specific roll, does mean just beauty, but is also emotional communication.

The colors tell stories even if there are no words.

“Drawings and illustrations”

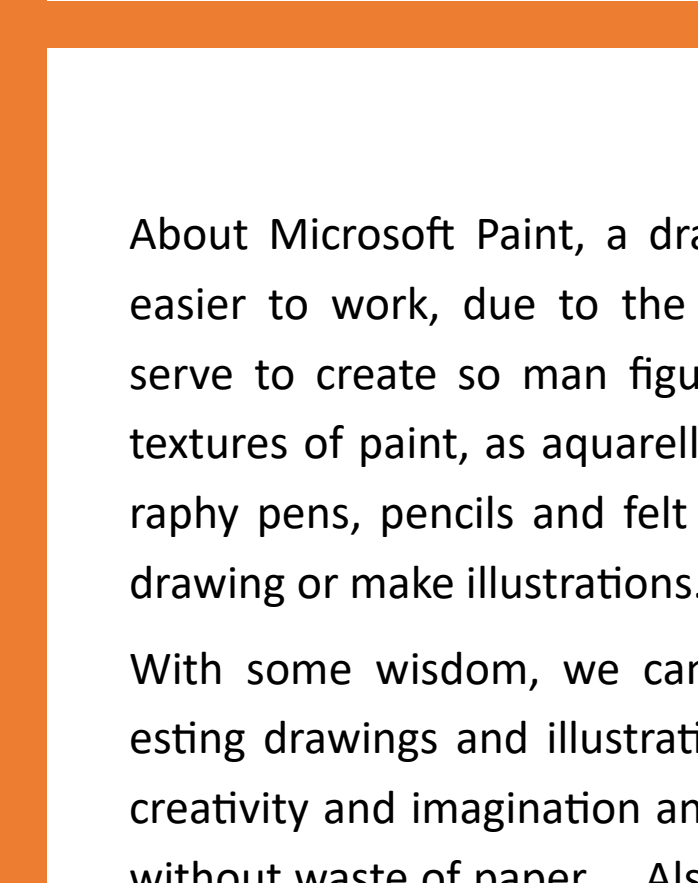
In last decades, technology has transformed the creation of art.

With some wisdom, we can create beautiful and interesting drawings and illustrations, some technique, a little creativity and imagination and that is it, the work is ready without waste of paper.... Also, can be printed, the printed works look gorgeous in photo paper.



To illustrators and artists, these tools are an extraordinary opportunity of work. With imagination, technique and dedication, it's possible to create illustrations or drawings with high quality, directly from a computer or tablet.

Digital art does not substitute the traditional techniques, in contrary, it amplifies possibilities of artists' creations.

THE TIMELESSNESS OF BOOKS

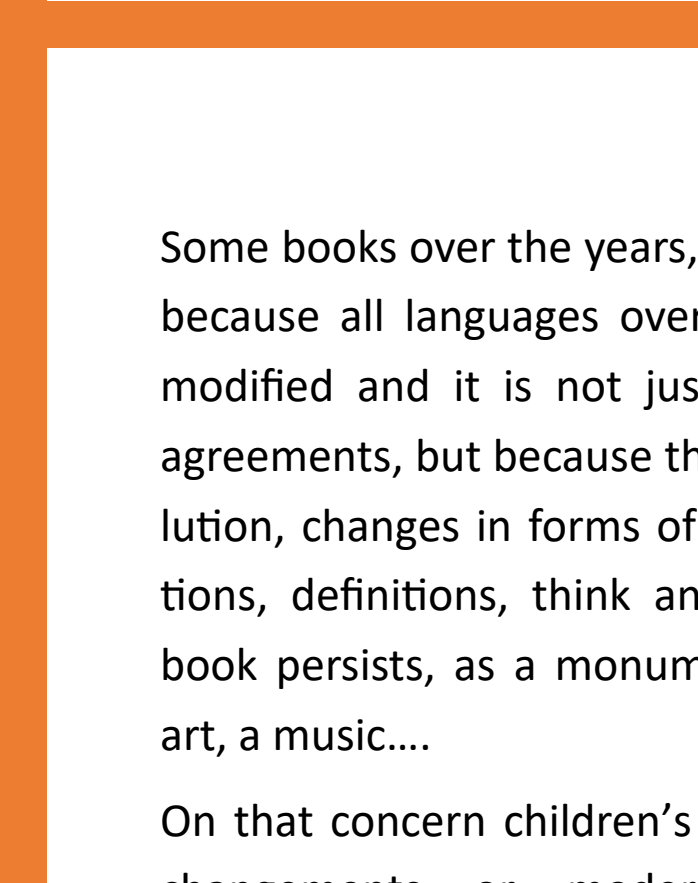
There are just a few forms of art crossing so many generations as a book.

Educational background was evolve and the school minimum was 9 school (basic school) years or 12 schools' years (secondary school) and some practical courses, that was to the general of students, some another's going to university.

We had already some entertainment (animated films on tv...) some books as Anita, Tintin and so one...expensive, just accessible to some persons, we had to concentrate in schoolbooks, that ones were important was the opinion of our parents.

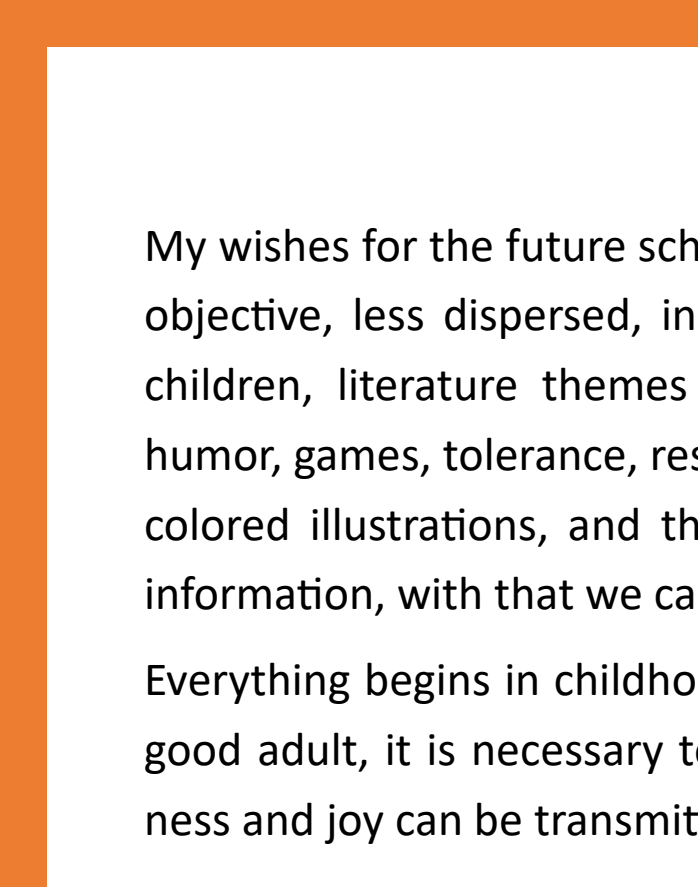
PRESENT OF BOOKS

Nowadays, schoolbooks have too much information, and are also a miscellany of themes, too many illustrations/drawings or images at the same page, scattering attention of a child, in face so much confusion, but very instructive and funny, but confused, less objective and without organization.

Children's literature or entertainment books are acquired because of their fashion, not by the content, book quality or learning books. Some parents cannot imagine a child can receive from a children's books: learn, listen or **see** a story, even if a child does not read, a drawing or illustration book can bring imagination or creativity development to a child and that is positive in his life. Everything begins in childhood, it is basic to become a good adult, it is necessary to be a happy child, happiness and joy can be transmitted by books.

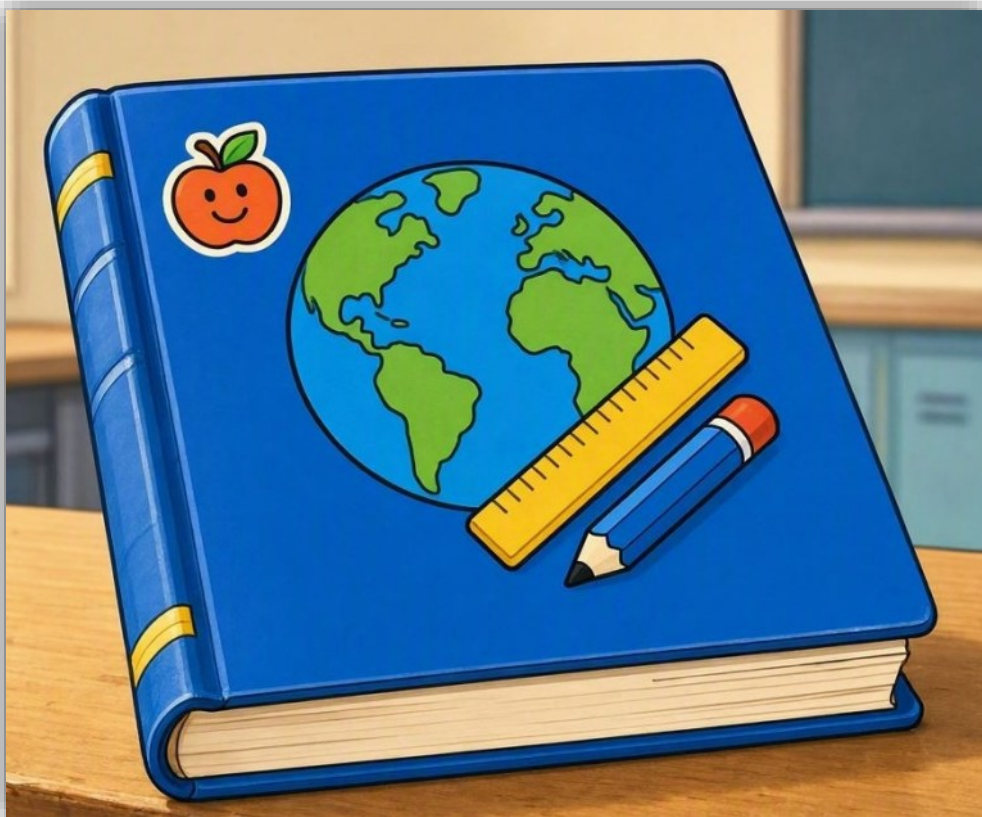


From my point of view, and before what I see nowadays in children and teens, I feel fear of the future of humanity in the world.

AUTHOR VS. WRITER

In the begin of the world literary, there was two words frequently used as synonymous “author” and “writer”. But these two definitions do not mean exactly the same, both contributed to the literary panorama of a country, but with different means.

Both have something in common, courage to transform their own feelings or social events into something that others can touch or think about.

EDITION AGREEMENTS

The different Editions agreement:

Edition by expenses from publisher – on this agreement model, publisher assume all the costs of production, distribution and promotion of work. Is the most interesting agreement to the authors, fair, correct but publishers are not all available to make it, they do not accept all the author's works to publisher, it is a form to control unnecessary publications, but is a great support to the authors, especially in the beginning of the career. Unfortunately, they are too selective, they take into consideration some insignificant details to choose author's work.

Edition by author expenses – also knew as auto publish work, to maintain all control about the creative and editorial process. This form of edition gives the author the possibility to show his own work without depending on third opinions but needs some financial investment and time from author. Evolution of digital platforms brings to authors the possibility to see their works published.

Edition by both parts – show lack of confidence on author, and publisher do not want take risks alone, this model of agreement means expenses and cost divided by both. Sometimes the true reason is the publisher has no funds to invest or has doubts about author's book.

An author has too many problems with publishers, some try to defraud the authors, as pay to see the book published, but he does not receive anything from wholesales, the profits belong to publishers and sometimes author must find some friends and family to purchase some of your own books.

That is why I like independent publishers and also platforms online; it is much better.

- Entertainment events;

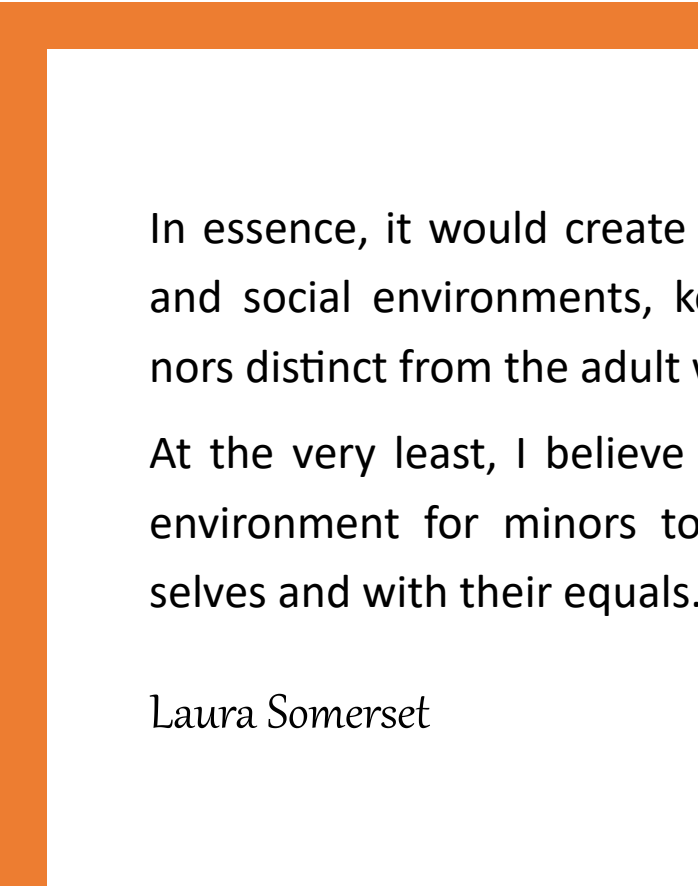
- Museums and other cultural events;
